Course Designing:

- a) After the grant of autonomy to Government College, Lahore in 1999 all existing courses were revised and new courses were introduced. For the first time in the history of this esteemed institution designed and introduced two new courses and on approval by the Board of Studies these were formally offered for study. One for the final year B.A Political Science class and the other for the M.A Political Science final year class.
- The title of Bachelors level final year Political Science course is, "Human Rights in South Asia", course code, PS 402. This was an optional course. Remained engaged in teaching this course from 1999-2003. The number of students rose from 06 in 1999-2000 to 09 in 2000-01 to 18 in 2001-02 and to 48 in 2002-03. (last academic year ended on June 16, 2003) with throughout 100% results.
 - The title of Master's level final year Political Science course is, "International Humanitarian Law", course code PS 620. This was also an optional course. During the first academic year 1999-2000 the course was opted by 18 out of 22 students. Remained associated with the teaching of this course from 1999 to 2002 with approximately 03 students failing in three years.
 - Designed a new course, "Comparative Constitutions", PS 401 for B.A Political Science final year class. The study of the constitution of the Islamic Republic of Iran was advised by the Board of Studies, for which I completed the course designing work during the summer vacations of the year 1999. It remained a part of B.A courses in Political Science up to 2005. It is continuously being taught as part of Political Science courses under the new semester scheme of studies to the students of B.A (Hon.) four year degree Programme during Year II Semester III "Comparative Constitutions", PS 201 and 202.
